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

A SYMPOSIUM ON DIVING MEDICINE

The daily lectures will be related to conditions and medications that can increase the risk of decompression illness, screening for substance abuse, drug testing modalities for substance abuse as related to human diseases and diving fitness. - Choose appropriate drug testing modalities to assist in the selection and monitoring of patients who may be candidates for long-term use of controlled substances.
- Counsel patients and families on preventative care, adequate inurance and high cost of futile care.
